Welcome to the Alabama Veterans Memorial Park!

Take a walk with us today on the Memorial Trail and learn about Alabama's Veterans

Locate the sign at the front of the path

 The sign says that the Park is dedicated to all Alabama military veterans from the 20th Century forward. The park was opened in 2001.

Walk down the Memorial Trail

Notice many plants and trees native to Alabama as well as the brick projects by Eagle Scouts.

Turn right at the end of the path and enter the American Flag Plaza

Leave the American Flag Plaza and continue down the trail to the Memorial Plaza where you will find the Regiment of Columns and the Hall of Honor

Find the **Medal of Honor Recipient Board** at the entrance to the Regiment of Columns
The Medal of Honor is the United States of America's highest military honor, awarded for personal acts of valor
above and beyond the call of duty. The medal is awarded by the President of the United States in the name of
Congress to US military personnel only. There are three versions of the medal; one for the Army, one for the
Navy, and one for the Air Force. Personnel of the Marine Corps and Coast Guard receive the Navy version. The
Medal of Honor is usually presented by the President at the White House in a formal ceremony intended to
represent the gratitude of the American people, with posthumous presentations made to the primary next of kin.

•	In your own words, explain how a Medal of Honor is earned

How many Alabama veterans have been awarded the Medal of Honor since 1900? (Hint: count all the veterans on the board, on the columns or on the website. 25 Choose 3 recipients to study. If you have a QR Code scanner, scan their QR Code listed on the Recipient Board to read more about the recipient or find their citations on the columns in the Regiment of Columns. Complete the table on the next page:

Enter the Memorial Plaza and the Regiment of Columns

- How many columns are there in the regiment? 36
 Each column is two feet in diameter and 20 feet in height. The Columns support aluminum casts of citations for Alabama's Medal of Honor recipients, veterans' stories, veterans' letters and 59 related original works of art designed by Alabama artists.
- Find the following on the columns. Place a check mark when you have found it.
- o The three Medal of Honor recipients citations that you chose above (HINT: middle of columns)
- Tuskegee Airman reference
- o A letter written to a veteran from a friend or family member
- A portrait of a veteran
- Art with LOVE or Kindness as the key word or theme
- o A note written in code
- What are some other images on the columns? Telegrams, letters, sculptures, hands, flowers.
 Eagle, soldiers, hearts, etc.

Go into the 23' by 46' Hall of Honor which is adjacent to the columns

Listed are the names of over 11,000 Alabamians (20% from Jefferson County) who died during conflict in the 20th and 21st Century wars. The names are displayed alphabetically within each war and the county of enlistment.

- What are the six wars that are shown in this memorial? World War I, World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War, Gulf War, War on Terrorism
- Name two presidents who are quoted in the Hall of Honor: Woodrow Wilson WWI
 Franklin D. Roosevelt and Harry Truman WWII; Harry Truman and Dwight D. Eisenhower –
 Korean War; John F. Kennedy, Lyndon Johnson and Richard Nixon Vietnam; George H. W.
 Bush Persian Gulf War;
- Record a veteran etching below. Hold the paper over a name and rub with a pencil over your paper. Also name the war in which this veteran served.
